**BEHAVIOUR IN CASE OF DANGER**

Fire service: Suitable extinguishing media: Carbon dioxide (CO₂). Dry extinguishing powder. alcohol resistant foam. Atomized water.

Collect contaminated fire extinguishing water separately. Do not allow entering drains or surface water.
Co-ordinate fire-fighting measures to the fire surroundings.

In case of ingestion: Rinse mouth thoroughly with water. Let water be drunken in little sips (dilution effect). Do NOT induce vomiting. In all cases of doubt, or when symptoms persist, seek medical advice.
